Oral and poster presentations

In a few weeks we will be contacting you to confirm the modality of your presentation. For making this meeting more accessible to non-English native speakers who are not so confident with this language, presentations can be also in Spanish or Portuguese as long as English is accessible (i.e. words on presentation slides in English).

Instructions

Oral presentations will be strictly timed by moderators to ensure that the schedule is followed. Please format your presentation as a PC-compatible Microsoft Powerpoint file (.pptx) or a PDF file, as Mac computers will not be available. **All presentations should be formatted for 16:9 aspect ratio.**

Speakers are expected to visit the **Speaker Ready Area** at the Secretary Table on the day before of her/his scheduled presentation and upload the presentation. We recommend speakers to bring their presentation on a jump/flash/usb drive. We will not be able to connect your own computer to the projection system. Talks should be tested, in particular if they include videos or animations. The recommended file formats for videos are .mp4 or .avi

Durations of presentations

Oral talks will be 12 minutes long plus 3 minutes for questions & transition between speakers.

Early Career Plenary talks will last 15 minutes plus 5 minutes for questions.

Plenary talks will be 50 minutes long with 10 extra minutes for questions.

Posters

All posters must be **90 cm wide and 1m 20 cm** high (36 inches wide and 47 inches high). We recommend leaving free space on each corner of the poster for the fasteners. Presenters will hang up their posters on the morning of the day of their assigned session on the board with the correct number leaving the board number visible.

During the poster sessions, presenters should stand near your poster to discuss the study and answer questions during the entire session. After the session finishes, we will ask presenters to remove their posters because we will be having new poster presentations on the following day.

Entry requirements for Uruguay

- Vaccinated visitors

Must prove vaccination by means of a certificate issued by the health authority of the country of origin and have received the single dose or the two doses against the SARS-CoV-2 virus (depending on the type of vaccine supplied). At least 14 days must have passed since the last dose was administered.

- Unvaccinated foreign nationals

Unvaccinated foreign nationals need to show proof of a negative result of the SARS-CoV-2 virus detection test (by molecular biology PCR-RT technique or antigen test), carried out no more than 72 (seventy-two) hours before the start of the trip, in a registered laboratory in the country of origin or transit.

- If you've had coronavirus within the last 90 days

Visitors who have had coronavirus within the last 90 days (from date of last positive test) and not less than 10 days before date of boarding, must show proof and need to adhere to the requirements stated above.

Important notes:

- In all the cases travelers must have medical cover in Uruguay or travel insurance. It is advisable that your insurance covers any expenses due to coronavirus related illness, quarantine or self-isolation for the duration of your stay. Visitors aged 6 or under do not require any of the above.

- If during your stay you present coronavirus symptoms you must self-isolate immediately, seek for medical advice and inform the congress organization


